### **Grade 12 GRAD Transit Passes**

It is once again graduation season, which means BC Transit is offering all grade 12 students a complimentary bus pass. GradPasses will be distributed by local transit providers in your community and should arrive directly to each high school in the district by mid-May for distribution to all graduates/grade 12 students.

The GradPass program is a valuable program that promotes public transit as a lifestyle choice, offering Grade 12 students free bus rides for any two days in June. Reminding students that public transit is an available and safe means of transportation, GradPASS aims to help students consider all transportation options when planning a safe ride home at graduation time, and throughout their lives.

### **Graduation Transitions Information** - Dear Grade 12 students and parents,

Graduation Transition interviews have been scheduled for the week of May 22<sup>nd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup>. Appointment times are posted across from the Brooks office. Some important information about these interviews:

- Students must show up for their scheduled interview – there are no opportunities for rescheduling. Please keep in mind that many of our interviewers are community volunteers and it’s important to be respectful of their time.
- Students must bring their completed Graduation Transitions packages to the interview.
- Students should approach the interview as they would a job interview: we encourage student to dress a step or two above their normal school outfits.
- All grade 12 students are to do their Grad Transitions package and interview, including students going into dual credit programs.
- Successful completion of Grad Transitions is a BC Ministry of Education graduation requirement.
